Introductions of current board members

Speaker DNR hydrologist Ethan Jensen gave the history of the Eagle Creek outlet. It is a DNR owned structure. Because of the breach in the structure, the DNR is planning to replace the structure, if not this fall (when water levels are at their lowest) then next year. If replacement funds do not get approved for this year, they will do a temporary repair in the fall. But he assured the group that this is a priority. The new structure will likely cost in the \$20,000 range. Mr Jensen will be doing site visits monthly. He explained the upstream lake level control systems, and assured that they are monitored closely.

Brian Knox explained that he & a small team watch for invasive species on the lake. They are watching closely for any signs of Milfoil or Starry Stonewort. There have been half a dozen or so zebra mussels confirmed, mostly in the Sunset Terrace area. The water quality is very good. He is looking for some water sample volunteers.

AIS inspectors are also sitting at the south landing this year, checking boats. Because of a grant received, the lake association will only pay a max of \$650.
